

# On Eagles' Wings to Sinai: From Pesach to Shavuot

Three months after their liberation from slavery, the Israelites find themselves standing at the foot of Mount Sinai. God says to them, "You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, how I bore you on the wings of eagles and brought you to Me" (Exodus 19:4).

I love that image—its magnificent power: this downtrodden people, rescued and lifted up, passengers on a divine eagle, flying away from their place of misery into the *midbar*, the wilderness. A place of freedom and purity. A place to stretch out and grow. But also a place of emptiness, of uncertainty—a place where the Israelites must reconstitute themselves as a nation of free women and men.


With freedom comes a new challenge.

Freedom they had, yes—but freedom is just the beginning of Jewish nationhood. For a people to become a nation, they need more than shared memory and trauma. They need a constitution—laws to bind themselves to one another as a polity, and to bind themselves to God as the source and sustainer of their identity.


Their Liberator, the One who bore them out of Egypt on eagles' wings, now becomes their Lawgiver. The One who flew them out of bondage comes down to Earth—descending upon Sinai in cloud and fire and voice—to seal and deepen a covenant that began generations before with Abraham and Sarah.

Matan Torah—the giving of the Torah—marks the beginning of the Israelites' national completion. With the gift of Torah, they receive not only sacred words, but the foundations of enduring peoplehood.

First, they are given a legal system by which to live, govern, and shape a just society. No longer merely a rescued group of refugees, they now become a people with structure, responsibility, and law.



Second, they are given a



Pesach places us on the eagle; Shavuot brings us to the foot of Mount Sinai. But to travel from the far shore of the Sea to the base of the Mountain, we need time - seven weeks of journeying, of preparation. We need Redemption, yes - but we also need Revelation.

Pesach gives us freedom; Sinai gives us purpose. With the last piece of matza finished not that long ago, we are now in the in-between: no longer in Egypt, not yet at Sinai. It is a time to reflect, to open ourselves, and to recognize that the one without the other is incomplete.

Only with both can we truly receive Torah, a people constituted by our shared memory, experience, under the wings of the God Who liberated us and gave us our most precious gift

It has been a wonderful year with them, as they have both contributed so much to our community, in so many ways. Rabbi Cohen and Betsy were key to creating our successful community Passover seder. Every month Rabbi Cohen does an "Ask the Rabbi "activity with Tree of Life preschool. He has arranged numerous speakers on zoom. For his final Saturday morning service with Beth Chaim, Rabbi Cohen has a group of six adults who will have a group Bar/Bat Mitzvah. We are grateful for all the joy and learning Rabbi Cohen and Betsy have shared at Beth Chaim.

If your friends or relatives have children who might be interested in our Beth Chaim religious school, please contact me or Shelby about scheduling a Preview Day for them, to try out our Sunday School program as a guest. Here is some interesting information about Norton and Gwen Levine, who rejoined Beth Chaim in March 2025.

**Beth Chaim:** Tell us about how you originally joined Beth Chaim.

**Gwen & Norton:** We were living in Danville in 1998, and we were looking for a Rabbi to marry us. Some friends recommended Rabbi Dan Goldblatt. He wanted to come to our house to meet us at 6 pm. Norton was working in Palo Alto at the time, and Gwen told him not to come home late, because "what would she say to a Rabbi while waiting for Norton to come home?" At 6 pm the doorbell rang, and it was Rabbi Dan. From the neck up he looked like a serious Rabbi, but he was wearing a Cleveland Indians t-shirt.

Norton was not home yet, but he grew up in the Cleveland area, as a huge sports fan! It was all meant to be. Even though Gwen had not converted to Judaism, Rabbi Dan had no problem marrying us. He met with us three times and came to Nevada City where the wedding was held. We loved Rabbi Dan – he was so wonderful to us!



We joined Beth Chaim while the initial fundraising was going on for several years to build our current building. We remember having services in a church and the softball team with Rabbi Dan. Many of the members we met back in those early days of Beth Chaim are still members!

**Beth Chaim:** Tell us about your family. **Gwen & Norton:** We are a blended family. Norton has a son and a daughter and five grandchildren who are all in Portland, Oregon. Gwen has a son in Lafayette, Colorado, and three grandchildren and two great granddaughters who are all living there.

Beth Chaim: Where did you grow up? Gwen & Norton: Gwen was born and raised in Glen Cove on Long Island, along with her three brothers and three sisters. Her mom was born and raised in New York and her dad is from Canton, China. Gwen graduated from Queens College with a BA in Elementary Education. Her husband at the time got a job transfer to San Francisco, so they moved to the Bay Area when her son James was five. After working in retail at Bullock's, Gwen got a job at Bank of America in SF when James started school. She started out as a teller and eventually worked her way up to be a VP of Operations, managing the ATM network on the branch side. She retired from BofA in 2007. Then Gwen was involved in tennis at Round Hill CC, and on the board at Assistance League for many years.

Norton grew up in the Shaker Heights area of Cleveland. He had a Bar Mitzvah at Heights Temple, which was conservative. Coincidentally, a few years ago he reconnected with Denny Berger, an ophthalmologist who now lives in Walnut Creek, who was his Bar Mitzvah partner in 1957 in Ohio! Small world!

Norton went to Ohio State in Columbus for undergraduate school and SF for Law School. He went to St. Thomas in the US Virgin Islands to practice law his first year after school ended. His son was born there, but they moved back to the Bay Area to raise their children, and his daughter was born in Walnut Creek. Norton continued to practice law, eventually working in Palo Alto for a financial planning company that helped companies go public. Norton retired about 10 years ago.

**Beth Chaim**: How did you two meet?

**Gwen & Norton:** We met when Gwen was working at BofA in San Francisco. We both grew up on deli food, so we went out to lunch in SF where they had the best pastrami sandwiches. Growing up on Long Island, most of Gwen's friends were Jewish. A friend's mom taught her how to make chopped liver and all the traditional Jewish foods. Norton especially likes Gwen's matzah brei and matzah ball soup.

**Beth Chaim:** Three years ago you moved to Colorado, but now you are back in your home in Alamo. Tell us about that.

**Gwen & Norton:** We decided to sell our house in Alamo and move to Colorado to be close to Gwen's son, his children and his grandchildren. But our house did not sell, so we rented it out.




I look forward to closing out the school year with you at all of these events and getting your feedback on things you'd like to see in our school next year.



#### Violet Dublin - May 10


