



The Rhythms of Life

Rabbi Dave

Everything has a rhythm. Nature has a rhythm. Sunrise and day. Sunset and night. The growth of spring leads to a flourishing summer. It gives way to the harvest and gentle decline of fall, leading to winter and rest and back to spring again.

Our bodies have rhythms. Our lungs expand and contract. Our hearts beat in rhythms. We have circadian rhythms, internal clocks regulating alertness and consciousness with rest and sleep.

Our lives emotional rhythms. We know joys and sorrows. Our relationships depend on both solitude and connection, on listening and speaking, and on giving and receiving.

And what else is Judaism other than a sanctification of life's rhythms and an appreciation of its Source? In prayer, we praise the Holy One who "yotzer ohr u'vorei choshech," who fashions the light of day and who creates darkness. From the early harvest that forms Passover's agricultural foundation to the late harvest that does likewise for Sukkot to the six days of work followed by Shabbat – everything has a rhythm.

For nearly 18 years, the rhythm of life carried our family away from the Bay and to the distant places of Jerusalem, Cincinnati, Atlanta, and Alexandria, Virginia. I am incredibly thankful that the rhythm of life brought us home at last. It feels so good. As I write these words, I am in my study at Beth Chaim, surrounded by bookshelves holding my rabbinic library. On the floor around me are boxes and boxes stacked high and full of more and more books.

In From Strength to Strength: Finding Success, Happiness, and Deep Purpose in the Second Half of Life, Arthur Brooks described an encounter with a tour guide at Taiwan's National Palace Museum and the guide's life changing advice. Standing before a massive jade carving of the Buddha, his guide remarked how the Eastern view of art differed from the Western view. "Westerners," she said, "See art as being created from nothing. In the East, we believe the art already exists. Our job is simply to reveal it. It is not visible because we add something, but because we take away the parts that are not the art."

I am humbled to serve as your rabbi. I am eager to get to know you, to know our history, to be your partner as we cocreate our future, and to share in the rhythms of life. And, after 25 years of walking an expansive path that led me here, I



also set a personal task before me: Like the process of removing non-essential books from my rabbinic library, in order to serve my highest purpose as a clear channel for Jewish wisdom, the rhythm of life now calls me to chip away at the non-essential to reveal my true self in this place, at this time, and in this stage. I pray to God for the insight, wisdom, and understanding to guide me on this path in service of the Holy One and our sacred congregation.

And what about the books that are no longer a part of my library? Truly, they are terrific, mostly Jewish titles, ranging from sacred texts to history to biographies to *tikkun olam* and so much more. They are looking for new homes and new readers, and it would be an honor to give them to you. Please accept a gift from my Jewish bookshelf to yours. At your convenience, stop by Beth Chaim during business hours and visit the bookshelves in the conference room in our main office. Feel free to say "hi" to me and let me know which book you chose. 

Beth Chaim: Tell us about your family.

Sarah: My mother Roslyn lives with us, my husband Ryan Lockhart, and our three children. Mathew Kuritz and Peter Lockhart are both 14 years old. Holden Kuritz-Lockhart is turning seven in August. Both Mathew and Peter will be attending San Ramon High School in the fall. Holden is in a special needs class at Creekside Elementary School. I was a single mom for many years with Mathew. Ryan and I were married by Rabbi Dan in October 2023. Having a Jewish wedding was very important to me. My Dad passed away 10 years ago, but we knew it would have been very important to him, too. It was a busy year because the following spring, May 2024, Mathew had his Bar Mitzvah.

Beth Chaim: Where did you grow up?

Sarah: I grew up in the same house I am in now, in Danville. I graduated from Monte Vista High School, then went to University of Arizona, where I studied communications. I worked in special ed for a long time, at various schools, then I taught preschool, then went back to school while working in the district. I am almost through with my master's degree in Elementary Education.

Summer 2025 is a BIG one for our Beit Midrash! We are introducing a new curriculum, building in more community time, and finding new ways to partner with our temple leadership as we welcome Rabbi Dave into our community.

Let's start with the big one: curriculum. Beth Chaim has

been blessed with the most consistent, committed and creative teachers that I've ever had the pleasure of working with. These teachers honed their curriculum to work out the kinks so every lesson was deep, robust, and workshopped. Our children learn so much from our teachers and the curricular path that was developed about ten years ago.

I've been talking with teachers and families for years about the things we want our children to know by the time they have their Bar and Bat Mitzvah. What does it mean to be Jewish? What does it feel like to be Jewish? What role does Jewish history and traditions have in forming children's Jewish identity? Our teachers address all of these in their classes and we are eager to have a curriculum that builds on itself year-to-year so these topics broaden and deepen rather than repeat.

Through many conversations with many (and I mean MANY) reform educators, I came across a curriculum called Shalom Learning. This curriculum uses Jewish Values to unite K-7th graders while providing grade-appropriate lessons that explore history, identity, holidays, traditions, and Hebrew. It is a spiral curriculum, so students encounter the same values each year but from a very different lens. The lesson plans are fully crafted, allowing newer teachers to have a fully formed base and allowing seasoned teachers to have new ways to think about these topics. Plus, there is an online portal so students and families can access extra Hebrew practice from home, and families can have week-to-week updates on what students are doing.

The most exciting component that I've found in this curriculum is their Jewish Pride and Unity unit that focuses on building Jewish identity in order to combat antisemitism. This curricular addition was created after October 7th and directly addresses ways to live a proud, Jewish life in the face of what we are experiencing today. There is also training for teachers and staff on how to use this curriculum in the most effective way. All of us at the Beit Midrash–myself, our teachers, Rabbi Dave, and the Temple leadership–are so excited to see how this curriculum strengthens our school!

We are also excited to strengthen our school by creating more opportunities for bonding. This year, we are bringing back in-person Hebrew sessions! We all saw how children learned so much from the individual Zoom Hebrew sessions, however we also saw that class bonding suffered. Children will have the opportunity to arrive early to play gaga and have pizza, then there will be concentrated Hebrew time for an hour, followed by 30-minutes of all-school games. This extended time will allow teachers and madrichim to pull students out for 1:1 time so we can maintain the magic of 1:1 zoom sessions. I'm so grateful to our Hebrew teachers for tackling this immense shift with creativity and flexibility. I can't wait to see 40 kids running around our sanctuary playing Hebrew scavenger hunts, relay races, and all kinds of other games that we are cooking up!

With all of these exciting changes along with the arrival of Rabbi Dave, we knew we had to kick the year off with a BANG. What better way to bring people together than to bring in an all-star? So, this year, our Annual Shabbat Summer Sing Out will feature nun-other-than (drum roll please...) RICK RECHT! That's right, on Friday, August 22 Rabbi Dave and Rick Recht will delight us with a musical Shabbat service and concert that bring the *Ruach* to a whole new level. Bring your picnic blanket/chairs, order Hazey BBQ via our link that will be sent out ahead of time, and get ready for a rockin' night. Gates open at 5:30 and the service/concert will begin at 6:15. A link to order tickets and Hazey BBQ will be sent out closer to the date!

I hope you all have a wonderful summer break! I'll be here delightedly swimming through our new curriculum and Hebrew games. As always, please feel free to reach out if you'd like to know more, if you have any questions, or if you'd like to chat!

Greening Beth Chaim – Tikkun Olam Starts at Home!



Remember those green bowls we used to use for all our ice cream sundaes at our Ruach services?
We are grateful to Ben and Jacob Freiman, sons of Harold and

Janet, for providing those bowls many years ago, and washing them after every ice cream oneg. We are repurposing them now for our First Shabbos dinners – they work perfectly as soup bowls! We are also excited to say goodbye to those red plastic cups! We now have blue cups that can be washed (even in the dishwasher!) and reused. We have recently added small kiddush cups so we won't have to use so many plastic ones.

All of this helps reduce our waste stream before it starts, which is more environmentally and economically sound than recycling. We are not giving up on recycling, so please be conscientious and put items in the proper waste bin when we have large events.







Here are a few housekeeping tips for the next time you are at Beth Chaim for an event:

- 1. Use the right disposal bins. We will have new signs for extra guidance.
- 2. Minimize usage of disposable items. Think before you reach for that paper or plastic item.
- 3. Try to stack your used plates and cups BEFORE throwing them in the trash. Stacked items occupy less space and we will save on waste overage costs.
