

We then delighted and danced through Sukkot and Simchat Torah, tasting the sweetness of this new chapter together.

Learning is already binding us. The Beit Midrash is off and running, implementing the values-based Shalom Learning curriculum. Our adult education class, "A Life of Meaning," has begun with energy and honesty, and I am savoring the questions you bring. And there is so much ahead - Shabbatot of prayer and presence, shared meals, our Chanukah celebration, two additional adult learning courses, a spring full of b'nei mitzvah as we lift up our newest Jewish adults, and countless moments of community woven from everyday kindness and purpose.

For now, I'm catching my breath so I can return ready. Thank you for the trust you've given me in these first 100 days. Thank you for the way you love this synagogue and one another. I'm grateful to be your rabbi, excited for the road we're building, and eager for what comes next — step by step, hand in hand, with joy.



Greening Beth Chaim – Tikkun Olam Starts at Home!

Here are a few housekeeping tips for the next time you are at Beth Chaim for an event:

- 1. Use the right disposal bins. We will have new signs for extra guidance.
- 2. Minimize usage of disposable items. Think before you reach for that paper or plastic item. We now have green bowls for soup or ice cream, blue cups for beverages, and small metal kiddush cups, all of which can be washed by hand or even in the dishwasher for larger amounts.
- 3. For our larger events, please stack your disposable used plates and cups BEFORE throwing them in the trash. Stacked items occupy less space and we will save on waste overage costs.







We want to reduce our waste stream before it starts, which is more environmentally and economically sound than recycling. But we are not giving up on that either, so please be conscientious!

If you like your trees and shrubs to look like they just came from a nursery, after they have been in your yard for years, we recommend hiring trained nurserymen. We do not butcher plants like too many untrained gardeners or take arbitrary cuts like arborists, we trim to make plants grow correctly.


