

TISHA B'AV

The most grief-drenched day on the Jewish calendar, marking the destruction of the first and second temples in Jerusalem as well as several other occasions for mourning.

"Tisha b'Av, Again" by Daniel Leger, RitualWell

Through these three weeks, growing in our apprehension,

we've waited.

Waited as the sun set for the sun to rise. We went to sleep each night waiting –

still with confidence -

knowing that the same setting sun's light

would brighten the morning sky, overcome the darkness of each night.

And we would see that we were

alive again

and that You, *HaShem*, would be here with us for one more

of Your creations: Another day. Yom ekhad.

The same sun sets once more tonight,

but do we dare

keep that same confidence in its rising again in the morning, bringing breath back to our lungs,

its light back to our eyes?

After 586 and 70 – After 1492 and 1939 –

After 2018?

By the rivers –

homeless, under bridges,

weeping with no tears left to cry,

our mouths open, gaping, stone tongues dry as sand.

Between the Tigris and the Euphrates, Between the Genil and the Thames,

Between the Allegheny and the Monongahela.

In Babylon, in Spain, In England,

Ukraine, California, Poland, Pittsburgh.

O Jerusalem!

We see the plows, we recoil at the crackle,

the gunshots deafen us.

We feel the mud drying on our shoeless feet,

the sickening rocking of the boats. We are cooked by the flames.

We are ripped open by the bullets.

As this day begins its dark descent

our tongues go dry again,

our ears lose the sound of the harp strings, displaced by shards of glass and metal casings.

Underground, underfoot,

sisters and brothers named and nameless, gone – taken – reminding us of what –

as we wonder and wander

these desolate corners of our souls unable to remember or forget or even muster a greeting of shalom.

Yes, I believe with a perfect faith

But do I, have I – really? If so, then why these

sunless days through centuries

of days and nights coming again and again and again,

covering us with this darkness -

this airless suffocation – this insatiable hunger?

And where, HaShem, are You

as we ask again these unanswerable questions

every year on this day?

Have You hidden, or have we hidden Your Face

from us?

Either way – we are terrified.

We have no strings to wrap

around our fingers for our *Shema* today. And we can't tap the leather boxes holding the treasure of Your word

as we recite Ashrei.

Here we are –
what's left of us –
sitting together on
the ash heap of the ages
with no light to see

even a handful of its grit and grime.

Do we need this again, Eternal One? Must we face this day without You?

Dare we beg of You – as we push ourselves

through these hours, that

if sunset comes again tomorrow at this time,

please, O Holy One of Blessing return to us again with it?
So that we may sing once more —

Adonai li, v' lo ira?

TU B'AV

Offering this meditation in contrast to the troubled spirit of Tisha b'Av, hopefully as an inspiration of resilience in times of sorrow and stress.

"Harnessing Tu b'Av" exerpted from a 2016 posting by Rabbi Rachel Barenblatt, the Velveteen Rabbi

On the Jewish calendar, the full moon of the lunar month of Av is Tu b'Av (the 15th of Av -- Hebrew numbers double as letters, so the number I"b becomes the word Tu.) Just a few days earlier we mark Tisha b'Av, the most grief-drenched day on the Jewish calendar, anniversary of the destruction of both Temples, anniversary of so many great shatterings in our people's history. That's the psycho-spiritual low point of the year. Immediately after that, the emotional tenor of our calendar starts looking up as we approach the Days of Awe. Tu b'Av -- the full moon following Tisha b'Av -- is supposed to be a day of joy.

This is the anniversary of the day when our mythic ancestors, condemned to wander in the wilderness for forty years because their lack of trust meant that they couldn't enter the land of promise, discovered that their years of alienation from God were over. There's a beautiful story about digging graves every year on Tisha b'Av and sleeping in them, and each year waking to discover that more of their number had died. This went on until the 40 years of wandering were complete, whereupon they [awakened], and everyone was still alive. By the 15th of the month, they realized that that chapter of their journey was over, and in wonderment they clambered out of their graves into renewed life.

Another tradition sees Tu b'Av as a kind of Jewish Valentine's Day. Talmud teaches that in antiquity this is when the unmarried women would put on white dresses and go dance in the vineyards, and by the end of the night they would have found husbands.

The challenge is harnessing the emotional uplift of Tu b'Av to help us climb out of our emotional low places even if there is no white dress in the vineyards, no simple happily-ever-after. On this day long ago our ancestors rejoiced that their years of deep alienation from God were over -- and then their story continued, with new challenges to face and new lessons to learn. We always have new challenges to face and new lessons to learn.

The work of authentic spiritual life is facing that truth not with dismay but with readiness. Whatever comes, we can find blessings in it, if we take the leap of faith of climbing out of our mourning. We can find blessings in whatever the next chapter of our story may be, even if we are not yet ready to dance.

We have had several families join Beth Chaim recently whom you may not have met. Here is an interview with one of our young member families who joined last year — Sarah and Ben Shapiro. They have two children, Abby and Noah, and are in our Young Family Chavurah. You may have met them recently at the Beth Chaim Welcome Home Fundraiser and auction. Ben helped us get many exciting sports package donations for this event!

Beth Chaim: Tell us about your family:

Sarah: Our whole family is really into sports. Abby is 11 and will be starting sixth grade at Stone Valley. She is on a Performance Team for dance. Soon she will start tumbling and theater. Noah will be nine in August and will be in third grade at Rancho Romero. Noah wants to be always outdoors, with a ball in his hands. He is on a competitive soccer team. His other main sports are tennis, baseball, basketball and flag football. We also have Jasper – a cockapoo, who is like our third child! Ben and I play a lot of tennis and many of our tennis friends are also members of Beth Chaim.

Beth Chaim: Where did you both grow up?

Sarah: I grew up in LaVerne in Southern California, which is next to the Claremont Colleges, technically in LA County. I grew up in a big Irish Catholic family – my grandfather came here from Ireland! But I was never confirmed - I just was not that religious.

Ben grew up in a very small town called Boonville, in Mendocino County. It's a town of 1000 people, three hours north of San Francisco. He had the very first Bar Mitzvah in Boonville. His family would drive an hour to go to a temple in Mendocino, but the Bar Mitzvah was in Boonville, with Rabbi Margaret from Mendocino. We had a Jewish wedding with Rabbi Margaret. Ben's family always welcomed me, and I have enjoyed learning more about Judaism as I go. Rabbi Margaret also did the baby naming for Abby and was there when Ben's Dad passed away five years ago. Rabbi Dan knows her and has even been to her house.

Beth Chaim: How did you two meet?

Sarah: We met in 2006 in Las Vegas! Ben was working for the Warriors, and they were there for summer league. I was there for my sister-in-law's Bachelorette Party. He was with a big group of guys and I was with a big group of girls at the



restaurant Tao in the Venetian, and he bought drinks for our table. We didn't notice each other right away, but soon we did, and then started going out. Three years later Ben proposed to me in Las Vegas, then surprised me by flying in our parents who were waiting for us at the same restaurant where we met – Tao.

I went to Cal Poly Pomona, then transferred to Cal State East Bay after I met Ben. I rented a small house in Alamo and majored in Business Marketing. I did buying and merchandising for upscale women's boutiques. Ben went to Sac State, where he played division one tennis, and majored in Business Marketing. He got a job with the Warriors and went to USF, where he got a master's degree in Sports Management. He was with the Warriors for 13 years, starting in sales, and by the time he left he was an Executive VP of Sales & Services. The team got new owners, and Ben left to

start Pivot, a sports marketing agency that does sponsorships and travel for the Warriors, Giants, and many other professional teams.

Beth Chaim: How did you choose Beth Chaim?

Sarah: We lived in Lafayette for 10 months before we moved to Alamo. We went to another temple a few times, but it felt a little too big for us. We went to High Holiday services at Beth Chaim before we joined, and really liked it. We have found the community to be very inviting. Rabbi Dan makes you feel very comfortable. We really liked the introductory meeting with him. It's nice that he takes the time to get to know people. We have noticed that the members love the Beth Chaim community – it exudes from them, especially at the recent Welcome Home fundraiser party. We are interested in connecting more with other families who have children in middle school and upper elementary school.





BCC is proud of its religious school program serving pre-school through high school. We offer Torah Tots, Sunday School for ages 5+, B'nei Mitzvah Program, Madrichim Program, and a robust teen program in partnership with Contra Costa Midrasha.

Grades K-7

Shavuot is my favorite Jewish holiday. I learned about this sacred day just a handful of years ago when I was exploring my Jewish identity while living in Oakland. Some friends started counting the Omer—something else I had never participated in—just after Pesach. We concluded the counting by staying up all night on Shavuot discussing themes in Torah we wrestled with. On the night of Shavuot this year, I was up at night with my four-month-old, which is a very different kind of metaphorical wrestling!

I'm grateful that I have these summer months to continue in the Shavuot spirit and dive deeply into what will further enliven our Beit Midrash. After introducing Mishpacha Groups, enriched Holiday celebrations, and a flurry of camp-like, whole-school activities, I saw how powerful and important Jewish community really is. Over the past two weeks I called every family in our Beit Midrash program. After hearing their feedback, my focus this year will be on expanding our Jewish community outside of the classroom, to younger families, and to our high school students.

Students' relationships can start on Sunday mornings, but they will thrive with out-of-school activities. I see this every year with the B'nei Mitzvah class: a special bonding that happens because students spend weekends together at services and celebrations. My hope is to start that bonding *now* by supporting families in each grade to plan at least one social event each semester. In addition, we will have community dinners before each *Ruach* service. I will build the space for the community to form, but we need family support to host and attend these gatherings!

The earlier a person connects with a Jewish community, the more Judaism becomes a way of life. Our Tot Programming is led by our stupendous first grade teacher, Lara Groch, who is also a PJ Library connector! Once a month she leads Torah Tots — a time for young children and families to learn about holidays and Jewish traditions—and Tot Shabbat—a child-focused Shabbat celebration. This year, we will have guest presenters to join Lara in providing Jewish fun and depth for families. I will also start Bagels and Blocks—a program for families with children 0-2 to connect, play, and share the joys and challenges of raising a Jewish family in the Bay Area. Focusing on these younger programs will provide a bridge to our Beit Midrash!

My hope is that our children will continue to seek Jewish community beyond their Bar or Bat Mitzvah. Joining our Madrichim Leadership Development Program is an important step for our children to stay connected to each other, Beth Chaim, and the larger Jewish community. Teens in this program will learn mentoring skills, facilitation strategies, project management techniques and more. I will work with each teen to develop and implement an activity stemming from their own interests. I truly hope parents will encourage your teens to enroll in the program!






